To the entire Spartan Family!

As we close in on another spring, it seems winter wants to really hang on and show it's fury. Please continue to be wise in all travels as we will continue all school activities until they may need to be postponed, then look closely for rescheduled events.

We are most thankful for the way our Boys' Basketball Team has played and has represented St. Peter's School and Parish. I am very happy for Coach Joe Jakubick and each young man on the team. I am very proud of their unselfish play on the court which has built them into a true powerhouse of a team. They have become a sort of icon for excellence on the court which we applaud, then we ask them to take that same ambition and success into the classroom as they work with Jesus in becoming all they can become. Only a few of our students might receive scholarships in athletics, yet every year many of our students get scholarship monies due to their hard work in academics. We applaud them all for shooting for very high levels of success.

It is with all these thoughts in mind that I need to share my personal thoughts about my future with you at this time. My wife, Diane and I, have decided it is time for me to retire from the lightning-paced life style of the principalship here at St. Peter's JHHS. I will be turning 65 this year and I will be leaving at the end of this fiscal year. I have found this job to be more of a "full-time life" than a 9 to 5 clock-in/clock-out scenario. I have found it most rewarding. I have given it my all and I am very proud of the many associations I have formed and the many sub-groups which I have been involved with here at St. Peter's.

I have discovered that this set of buildings is not just a huge monument in the downtown Mansfield area. It is a living, breathing entity with very many people holding the Cross of Christ high for the entire area to see. The list of people that keep that Cross erect and pointing toward heaven are too many to mention here. But it is a strong set of parishioners and non-parishioners who have joined together to share the strong Catholic/Christian values which other schools are not allowed to hold high. This is why this solid foundation is so very more than the brick, stone and mortar which holds it together. This school as all other Catholic schools today, need that structure, and yet, it requires the heartbeats of its people to make it go on each and every day. I'm glad Fr. Hite and those who selected me three years ago, gave me the chance to help lead it, while also helping to keep the Cross high.

I don't plan "to go quietly into the night", but to stay as active in the Toledo Diocese as I can. Being a deacon will give me many opportunities to do so. I have spent all of 33 and a half of my teaching/administrating years in Catholic schools and I have enjoyed the challenges. I started at Cincinnati Elder (1550 boys at the time) for 1/2 year teaching Science, then went on to St. Paul, Norwalk. I taught Sciences and coached boys' basketball for 6 years there. Then I went on to Willard St. Francis as principal for a year, and then to Mansfield St. Mary's as principal for five years. Then, I was Dean of Students at Fostoria St. Wendelin for a year.

In between those jobs I worked in the masonry field for my two brothers or in my own masonry business. Then, in 1997-98 I went back to St. Paul's to coach girls' basketball and teach sciences. Then, in 2013, after becoming a deacon, I contacted Fr. Hite, who gave me the chance to sit in this principal's chair. What a ride it has been and I must say an experience of a lifetime. I have met many people and made a lot of friends and I am very happy to have been a part of this fine school system.

I wish nothing but the best for this great St. Peter's Catholic School system. I will miss the camaraderie and friendship which I hope will continue. And I will continue my prayers for everyone here.

The program also includes art, music, physical education and computer classes, all taught by specialists.

**FASTING AND ABSTINENCE FOR CATHOLICS**

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence.

For members of the Latin Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal. Two smaller meals may also be taken, but not to equal a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards.

If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night) as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus, and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily his Resurrection.

Out of pastoral solicitude, Bishop Daniel Thomas has formally dispensed the faithful of the Diocese of Toledo from the obligation to abstain from meat on the Memorial of Saint Patrick, Bishop, which will be observed this year on Friday, March 17. Those who choose to partake of meat on that day are encouraged to undertake another penance that day in the form of a corporal or spiritual work of mercy. In this way, a faithful Catholic still keeps the penitential spirit of a Friday in Lent and unites oneself more closely with the suffering Christ and His Church.
