I received a great education and more importantly a solid foundation for my life as an adult. Thankfully, I was also fortunate to receive assistance when it was difficult for my parents to afford tuition.

Catholic Schools are a sacrifice for families. For some, it means a longer bus ride or carpool trip downtown. Many others believe it's something they simply can't afford.

However, if you are a practicing Catholic family at St. Peter's, and if you participate actively in your faith – we will make every effort to provide any assistance you need. Educating children of St. Peter's Parish is our prime mission.

Today, more than ever there are funds available for tuition assistance, or you may qualify for a state voucher. You can also play sports for your home district if we don't offer the program.

So, what makes Catholic Schools different? The reasons are many, but I'll share this example.

As I participate in the Richland County Leadership Unlimited program this year, one topic continues to come to the forefront – young adults entering the workforce lack "soft skills." These are a combination of people skills, social skills and career attributes.

At St. Peter's I would like to believe we teach soft skills as part of our core mission, starting in our *Virtues in Practice* program in the Elementary, followed by our Service Hour requirements in the Junior High & High School. These key character development programs help build a foundation of a **St. Pete's Kid**. Nothing makes me happier to hear from an employer that they love to hire kids from St. Peter's.

Our doors are open, and we would love to have you join our school family next year. It is an investment in your child's future.

FASTING & ABSTINENCE FOR CATHOLICS

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence.

For members of the Latin Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal. Two smaller meals may also be taken, but not to equal a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards.

If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night) as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus, and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily his Resurrection.

Out of pastoral solicitude, Bishop Daniel Thomas has formally dispensed the faithful of the Diocese of Toledo from the obligation to abstain from meat on the Memorial of Saint Patrick, Bishop, which will be observed this year on Friday, March 17. Those who choose to partake of meat on that day are encouraged to undertake another penance that day in the form of a corporal or spiritual work of mercy. In this way, a faithful Catholic still keeps the penitential spirit of a Friday in Lent and unites oneself more closely with the suffering Christ and His Church.

March 20 Prayer Vigil for the Abolishment of the Death Penalty in Ohio. Never underestimate the power of prayer! People of all faiths across Northwest and West Central Ohio are invited to gather to pray for the victims of crime, those facing execution, and the abolishment of Ohio's death penalty. A Candlelight Vigil for Life will be held on Monday, March 20, at 7 p.m. at St. Gerard Parish, 240 West Robb Avenue, Lima, OH, with Rev. Michael D. Sergi presiding. After a three-year hiatus, Ohio's plans to resume executions by lethal injection in 2017 are on hold. On Jan. 26, 2017, a federal judge ruled midazolam, used in the State of Ohio's drug protocol for executions, constitutes cruel and unusual punishment. Ohio's first execution in three years is now scheduled for May 10, 2017. Bishop Daniel E. Thomas urges all Catholics and people of good will to take five steps to abolish the death penalty in the State of Ohio: 1. Pray for the victims of crime, those facing execution, and those working in the criminal justice system; 2. Reach out to

the families of those affected by violent crime by bringing Christ's love and compassion; 3. Learn about the Church's teaching on capital punishment and educate others in this vital area of concern by visiting: <http://www.usccb.org/issues-and-action/human-life-and-dignity/death-penalty-capital-punishment/index.cfm>; 4. Advocate for the end of the death penalty by sending a postcard and by calling Governor John Kasich at: 614-466-3555, urging clemency for all 139 individuals on death row in the State of Ohio. 5. Join us for a series of monthly prayer vigils being planned throughout the Diocese of Toledo.
