100 Years Ago This Month

As many already know, construction on the present St. Peter's Church began in the Spring of 1911. Four years later, on September 12, 1915, the first Mass was celebrated in the new building, in the church basement, as construction continued on the rest of the Church. The formal dedication of the Church took place just two years later on September 16, 1917. We owe a debt of gratitude to our ancestors in faith in Mansfield as they sacrificed and labored to build a fitting place of worship here. We also owe a debt of gratitude to Sister Paula Bingert, who has maintained the archives here and who has worked tirelessly to help us remain mindful of our wonderful heritage!

Several weeks of school have gone by and we have all survived! The students appear to be in the swing of things. The building is buzzing with business. The weather has cooperated as the temperatures have been cool. At this time, our enrollment is 253 students! We are enthusiastic about the new school year.

On August 24, we took part in the 54 Day Rosary Novena—the Bishop’s traveling Rosary. The Novena started on August 15, the Assumption. 

In late July, Bishop Thomas approved the implementation of a Capital Campaign at St. Peter's Parish. The Development Office has been working closely with our Properties Committee to obtain updated quotes for the projects we hope to complete.

Our goal is to raise \$3 million. However, we will only complete projects as we receive the funding needed. Based on the feedback of parishioners in the feasibility study phase, our work will focus on the needs of the church and campus security first.

Over the next couple of months, you will hear much about the campaign and the projects we hope to complete. Since this is a complete as funded project, you will most likely not see work begin until the year 2017 or later. Also, keep in mind that each of these projects will require Diocesan approval from multiple committees before work can commence. We are committed to having work completed by professionals who are proficient in historic worship spaces like St. Peter's Church.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Orthodox Christians have a saying about the reality of sin. They speak of "this holy and sinful Church, which we love." We know all too well the effects of sin on the faith community. From our earliest days, we have seen baptism as a place where the old self dies in Christ, dies to sin, and rises to new life. Our ancestors in faith held that post baptismal major sin was unthinkable. Yet, as one Baptist minister once explained, "We know that sin is drowned in the water, but it would appear that the devil is a pretty good swimmer."

The origins of the sacrament of penance have to do with a similar insight among bishops in the early church. A critical question for them was whether or not a baptized person who had committed a public sin could be re established in church life, forgiven, and restored. Forgiven, yes, was an early answer, but restored was another matter. Penance would be a permanent lifestyle for the forgiven; they would live at the margins of the community, clearly visible in distinctive garments, and their access to the table of the Eucharist was restricted. The harsh beginnings of public penance led in time to a true treasure of our tradition: the ability to find our way home through the ministry of others, and a way for all of us sinners to experience the gentle embrace of our forgiving Lord.

LABOR

A FAMILY PERSPECTIVE: Because the deaf man in today's Gospel recognized his disability, he could seek help from Jesus. Deafness abounds in families: in our children ("Oh dad, not again!"), in parents ("It is just a stage."), and in spouses ("Are you listening?").
