Sometimes people question where God is. I don't have to look any farther than my 3 year old to get an answer to this question... God is everywhere.

Recently, we try to have these conversations where we find out a little more about how the world works. "What do you think makes that car move?" "How do the trees grow so high?" "Why don't rocks talk?" and of course, my personal favorite so far, "What makes fuzz between your toes?" (posed to me by my two year old). When I repeat the questions back to them my three year old always has an answer without hesitation: God. In fact he is so convinced that his answer of God is always right that he allows it to be the answer for other life situations. For about a month he kept telling me that when he went to school he was getting pushed down on the playground. I finally decided that I might need to send the teacher a note explaining what was happening just so she could keep an eye out. When I pressed him for a name of who was doing this to him, he simply answered, "Jesus". Needless to say no note was sent because it is a little hard to tell the teacher that the Savior of the world is involved in hijinks on the playground!

I think it is beautiful that he credits God for everything that is around us because he in fact is right in doing so. I don't consider my child at all a Mensa scholar by any means (after all you cannot consider someone who constantly still claims that everyone's name is "tato" as the next person in line to go to Harvard on early admission), but I do think he, as well as all children, are very astute. They see the reality of the situation without much thought because they don't let their minds to become clouded by doubt. Children are simple and blessed, and if you ask them who is responsible for everything in the world it would not be scientists or teachers or doctors, but rather it would be God.

Soon we will be celebrating Easter, and there is no better way than I can think of to celebrate than to not only be in awe and wonder of Christ's rising from the dead, but to appreciate all that he has done for us! Through childlike eyes we need to look at the world and see with what sovereignty and majesty that God created it, and to recognize our very minimal role in the world without him.
