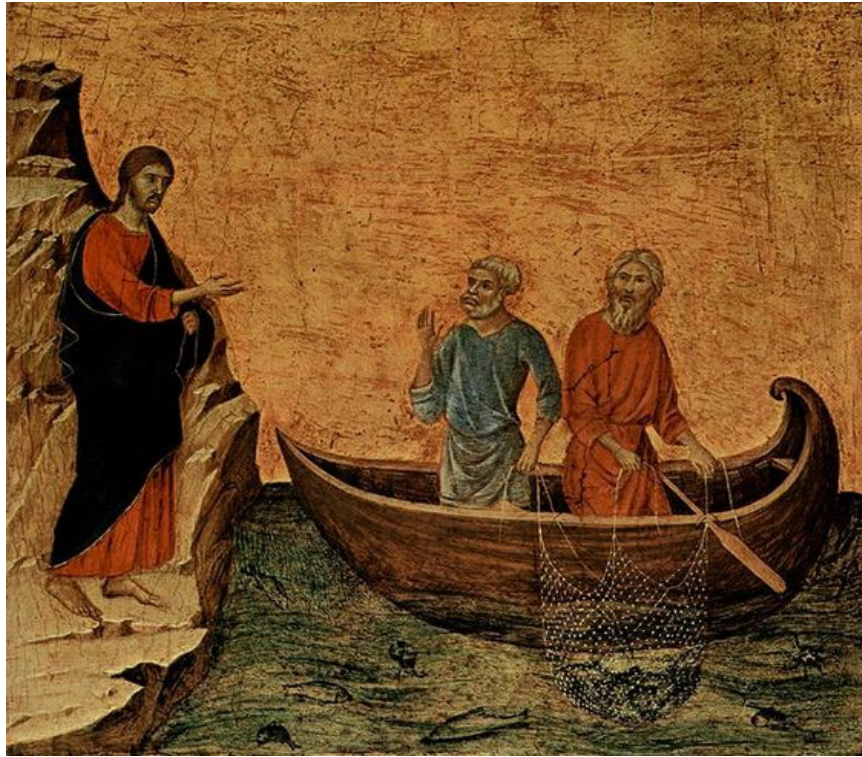

THE CHILDREN'S LITURGY OF THE WORD**February 2** Angie Rebecca/Angie

I have said it before in this column. God has a way of subverting our expectations. You might even say that God delights in turning the tables on us.

After all, we were sent a Messiah born in a stable and laid in a manger, conceived out of wedlock under mysterious circumstances which would have ordinarily resulted in his mother being stoned to death. We follow a carpenter who became a preacher and teacher. And we believe in a preacher who was condemned as a criminal because he taught us about love, and who was sentenced to death and executed between two other criminals. Our hopes for salvation and deliverance were dashed as the preacher's body was sealed in a stone tomb, ostensibly marking the end of his message and the disintegration of our hope. It's scarcely the stuff of a good story with an expected, long-awaited happy ending.

A case in point: today's Gospel tells us that Jesus left Nazareth after the death of John the Baptist and went to Galilee, where he settled in Capernaum on the shores of the Sea of Galilee. In the eyes and minds of upright Israelites the move to Capernaum must have seemed akin to leaping from the dustbin to the trash heap. John's Gospel reminds us of what Bartholomew said to Philip upon being called to meet Jesus, "Can anything good come out of Nazareth?" (John 1:46) Bartholomew's reaction is noteworthy because he reflects a commonly held expectation. He does not believe the Messiah could come from Nazareth.

But that's only half the picture. If someone were to ask Bartholomew if there was anything worse than being from Nazareth, he would very likely tell you that apart from being a Samaritan, about the worst place you could live in Israel was in Galilee. As the Gospel tells us, Galilee was referred to, in biblical parlance, as "Galilee of the Gentiles." To put it plainly, the Gentiles were not part of the chosen people. They were only marginally better than Samaritans in the minds of the most religious Jews.

Yet it is God's promise in our first reading, repeated in the Gospel, that the region of Galilee was to be exalted by the coming of the Messiah and, to quote those deeply moving words from Isaiah, "... The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light. Upon those living in a land of gloom (*I prefer the more eloquent, 'upon those who dwell in a land overshadowed by death'...*) a light has shone." (Isaiah 9:1) The unspoken message here is incredibly important, both to the Jews of Jesus' time and to the Gentiles then and to us (the Gentiles now).

The expectation that anyone is somehow excluded from the love of God, or that anyone is denied the hope of salvation is, as they say, shot to pieces. It is utterly discredited and I cannot imagine anything more shocking to a self-righteous, self-justified society of religious bigots and hypocrites than that idea.

But God does delight in subverting our expectations. So the son of a carpenter, born in a cow-shed, ridiculed and rejected, condemned, crucified and buried is God's answer. He is God's answer to our woundedness; to our struggles; and even to our deaths. Yes, we who have dwelt in darkness have seen light. Once overshadowed by death, light has arisen over us. The darkness cannot win. It cannot overcome the light.

There's a reason we are given a lighted candle at our baptism. There's a reason we pass the light along during the Easter Vigil. I like to think that as we receive the light we are being sacramentally and symbolically invited to help God to subvert the expectations of the world. We are being invited to bring light and love to the lives of those who are least likely to "deserve" it. They aren't far away. They aren't hard to find. Perhaps a good resolution for 2020 would be to seek for them and to lovingly and warmly invite them into our midst. What do you think?

PARISH REGISTRATION:

If you have been attending St. Peter's on a regular basis, and wish to register in our parish, please contact **our parish office: 419.524.2572.**

Registration in a parish is important for a number of reasons: if you anticipate having a child baptized, it is expected that you are registered and regularly attending Mass; if you need a letter from our parish to be a Confirmation sponsor, it is expected you are fully initiated in the Catholic faith and participating regularly at Eucharist; if you wish to be married according to the laws of our faith, your registration and participation is expected. Frequently, there are occasions when a letter from the Pastor of your current parish are requested.

Moreover, you will receive regular parish mailings, including offering envelopes (or informing us if you wish to go electronic fund transfer – EFT)— it is important that we know your wishes.

If you transfer parishes, it is also important that you inform us in order that we may remove you from our parish registration and regular parish mailings. It helps to keep our records up to date.

COLD AND FLU SEASON IS UPON US

If you have the flu or a cold please refrain from shaking hands and from drinking from the Communion cups at Mass. Our faith teaches us that the entire Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Christ are contained in each of the Eucharistic species.

STATE OF OHIO SCHOOL CHOICE SCHOLARSHIPS—IMPORTANT CHANGES

Across Ohio, thousands of parents use state-funded scholarships to send their children to the school they choose. St. Peter's Catholic School is a registered "provider school" with the State of Ohio School Choice Scholarship Program.

THERE ARE SOME IMPORTANT CHANGES AND UPDATES WITH TWO OF THE STATE FUNDED SCHOLARSHIPS

Educational Choice Scholarship (EdChoice)

EdChoice provides scholarships to students who attend the state's underperforming public schools. For the 2020-2021 school year, numerous schools have been newly added to the ODE designated list of underperforming schools so students assigned to those schools are eligible for the scholarship. **Prospect, Sherman, Woodland, Madison South and Mifflin elementary schools, Mansfield Middle School, and Mansfield Senior High are some of the area public schools on the ODE designated list.**

Ed Choice Expansion

This scholarship is based only on family income. For the 2020-2021 school year, **students in ALL grades K through 12** whose family's income is at or below 200% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines are eligible to apply. For example, last year a family of four earning \$51,500 or less was eligible to apply for the scholarship. *Families currently enrolled at St. Peter's who meet these requirements are eligible to apply.*

IMPORTANT: The application period for EdChoice and EdChoice Expansion scholarships is February 1 through April. Once the admission process is complete to attend St. Peter's School for the 2020-2021 school year, application for state scholarships can begin. The sooner that process begins, the better.

TODAY'S READINGS

First Reading — God has restored the land, and brought great joy to the people (Isaiah 8:23 — 9:3).

Psalm — The Lord is my light and my salvation (Psalm 27).

Second Reading — Paul exhorts the believers at Corinth: As there is one Christ, so too must there be no divisions among you (1 Corinthians 1:10-13, 17).

Gospel — After calling his first disciples, Jesus goes throughout Galilee (Matthew 4:12-23 [12-17]).
