

*The old man was a collector of watercolors...and had been since his youth. He fancied himself something of an expert in the subject and thought he had a very discerning eye. He collected only the most appealing and vividly colorful pieces. By any account, his collection would have been the envy of everyone. Would have been...*

*You see, the old man was somewhat peculiar in his habits. From his youth onward, he never put anything on display. He believed he needed to wait until his collection was perfect...until he had the perfect place to display the pieces...until they could all be framed perfectly and until he had the time to devote to sharing his wonderful collection with the world.*

*So he just put them away. Every watercolor he bought, he stored in boxes in a closet in his dining room. There were boxes upon boxes and he would, occasionally, open the closet and gaze at them...recalling with fondness the day he bought this or that piece or he'd think about how a particular piece so reminded him of a Monet he'd seen once in a museum somewhere.*

*The day came when the old man finally retired. At last he felt sure he would have the time and the means to devote to sharing his magnificent collection with the rest of the world. On a fine spring morning, he opened the dining room closet and began to remove the boxes, piling them upon the hutch and the dining room table and the chairs. His heart was cheerful as he thought about what beauty he would bring to the world and how people would remember the wonderful collection he would now reveal.*

*He began with the oldest box, collected when he was but twenty-two years old. He remembered and smiled as he lifted the lid. Horror! Oh no! No! His beautiful watercolors had disintegrated into thousands tiny pieces...each of the original works so dried and cracked with age that they simply fell apart as he lifted them out. Box after box revealed the same fate. Not having been put into frames, they had simply rotted with age and fallen into dust. The world would never know the beauty he'd been saving for decades.*

I couldn't resist telling this parable as we come to the close of another Easter season. When I talk with neophytes (those who were most recently initiated into the faith), I make a point of telling them to become involved. I remind them that they have been given the faith to share and that they should find something...some way of sharing themselves and their gifts and talents with the body of Christ.

**SCHOOL NEWS**

**CONGRATULATIONS** to St. Peter's Elementary School math teacher, Mrs. Tara Arnold, and long-time art instructor for St. Peter's High School & Junior High, Mr. Frank Daniell.

Mrs. Arnold was selected as the Toledo Diocese representative for the professional development program Alliance for Catholic Educators Collaborative for Academic Excellence. The program is designed to strengthen curriculum, instruction and assessment in Catholic schools. As part of the ACE program, she went to the University of Notre Dame in March where she spent three days collaborating and learning with teachers across the country how to best implement the Common Core State Standards in mathematics. Mrs. Arnold will share this information with teachers in our diocesan schools.

Mr. Frank Daniell, art instructor at St. Peter's High School for many years, was recognized at this year's Mansfield Art Center May Show, now in its 70th year of showcasing Ohio artists. The May Show opened this past Saturday and features 110 works of art by 85 artists. Director emeritus Juror H. Daniel Butts III, who served as Mansfield Art Center director from 1968 to 2001, presented Mr. Daniell with the Lifetime Achievement Award.

Of course, the parable tells about a man who waited too long to share his gifts and, in our faith, we know that it's never too late. What we might not know is that in some sense, we are all still neophytes...just beginning the walk of faith... still growing in our spiritual life even if we are as old as the man in the parable.

If you've never thought of getting involved...too busy or nothing to give as we sometimes think, I urge you to think again! As the Choir Director, I want people who are musically talented to share their talents in our Parish Music program, but of course there are hundreds of ways to share our time and talent... not just in music. The point is, get involved!! Your Parish family needs you. I'll end this little meditation with this one thought: God doesn't call those who are equipped for the task. God equips those he calls. To what is God calling you?

## LOVE ONE ANOTHER

Last Sunday we heard the familiar passage from John's Gospel in which Jesus uses the metaphor of the vine and the branches. In that passage we were told that if we remained in Christ we would bear much fruit. Today's Gospel tells us just what that fruit is: love. Today's second reading and Gospel together create a great hymn to love. The chorus of this hymn is simple—God loves us so much that Jesus was sent into the world so that we would have life. The Lord Jesus, who last week told us to remain in him, this week tells us to remain in his love. In a world marked by division and terrorism, the Lord's final words in today's Gospel are a great challenge: "This I command you: love one another."



## TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

With June not far off, attention in the parish turns to the celebration of weddings. Perhaps no other area of parish life is more shaped or challenged by the expectations of our culture. An old Irish proverb, "Marry in Lent and you're soon to repent," is amplified by another warning: "Marry in May and rue the day!" Memories of old pagan parties in May endured, and the Irish felt wedding receptions in May would be a stress on community morals. Queen Victoria did not approve of May weddings either, and her influence is still felt on family calendars, as is her daughter's introduction of the white wedding gown. Sometimes we mistake customs and curiosities for tradition. Tradition with a capital "T" has to do with Christ's miraculous rescue of the wedding feast at Cana, his affirmation of a man and woman pledging lifelong fidelity at the heart of a community's feast. The Church cherished that memory over time, but it took a millennium for us to think of marriage as a sacrament. Much of the rest of what we associate with weddings has to do with culture, customs, and family practices. A wise rabbi once said that "tradition is not wearing your father's hat; tradition is having a child." Don't let Queen Victoria reign over your wedding plans!
