Two weeks ago Amos of the Old Testament erupted verbally with the words, "Woe to the complacent!". These were words he used to badger Israel's Northern Kingdom's elite rich into having a heads-up for the poor. They did not listen and soon thereafter, went into exile. I wondered how many of our students were really listening to that Epistle as I felt a direct correlation to life at our St. Peter's High School. After all, we only go through high school once and the importance of doing your best at all times is imperative to having those all important transcripts for admittance into the college of choice in the highest caliber of excellence. Amos' main warning, though, has much more to do with doing our part to take care of the poor among us rather than our college choice today. Yet, I see a good parallel in these ideas in that all our students need to be fully ingrained in their search for exactly what God wants each one of them to do with all the gifts he or she has been given. If complacency does exist, then each child will not attain their highest level of performance and, therefore, may miss the mark of becoming just what the good Lord (and he or she) has in mind. With all the gifts we have available, we had also better include caring for the poor as an on-going goal in whatever ways we can.

The Gospel reading of two weeks ago gives another warning. Jesus attempts to advise the Pharisees in the reading that we are all given the chance on earth to feed the hungry, and that the poor on earth (represented by Lazarus) and those who care for them, will receive their due heavenly reward. Those who do not help the poor, will have eternal torment. And Jesus says that the chasm between heaven and hell is so great that there will be no communication between the two. And Jesus goes on to say that even if a person risen from the dead would go to family members of grave sinners, that risen person would not have the verbal power to convince the rich and their families to turn in the direction of Christ Our Lord.

Here at St. Peter's we do try very hard to convince our students to take notice of the poor and needy. Our food collections and fund raising for the various needs of students' and parishioners' intentions seem to be on-going. Maybe this continuous process of giving really does give our students an opportunity to get in the good habit of helping those with needs now and then, in their future, they might seem to have a constant eye on "our brother" whether on the streets or in some other situation in life only we can provide an answer to. This just might be a calling from Jesus Himself?

How do we all become less complacent and more giving... unless we create the good habit of doing so today? We hope that the Freshman, Sophomore, and Junior Retreats which have taken place in the last two weeks have created an avenue for our students to a true understanding of the poor and how we might really help out. We also pray for the Seniors as they will be going on their Kairos Retreat in just two weeks to Carrey. God bless all those who have a hand in continuously adjusting the aim of our students to follow Christ in all they do. And never forget the poor!

Total Budgeted Sunday/School Collection To Date

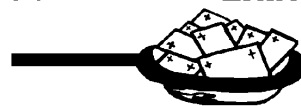
Represents the total budgeted Sunday/School collection through the time period referenced.

Jubilee Year of Mercy

Twenty-eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Jubilee of Marian Devotion

This weekend, the Jubilee honors Mary under the title Pope Francis suggests, "Mother of Mercy." Recall the Good Samaritan Gospel. Priest and Levite saw suffering but showed no mercy. Recall the rich man, who never saw Lazarus right before his eyes, and showed no mercy. Today, Jesus sees ten lepers from afar and shows extraordinary mercy. Mary's entire life, declares Francis, was modeled on Jesus, "Mercy-Made-Flesh." Indeed, standing at the cross, Mary saw Jesus' mercy take flesh when Jesus showed mercy to the executioners. So Pope Francis recommends we frequently pray the *Salve Regina*, Hail, Holy Queen, asking her to ever look upon us with mercy, so that we might be worthy to gaze upon the face of her merciful Son Jesus. May we do so not only in eternity, but here and now, opening our eyes to see Jesus in others, and our hearts to serve Jesus in others by loving deeds of unconditional mercy.
